YPI 2020/2021: National summary

- **13,110 students** completed YPI at 93 schools nationally during COVID-19
- **465** educators received orientation, resources, and ongoing staff support
- **Students delivered research about est. 2,625** charities across Canada
- **65,550** people learned about social issues and charities from the students
- **Over \$500,000** was awarded to 256 charities (\$465K through the schools, and \$35K through special initiatives, such as giving circles that use YPI student research to make decisions about where to grant in their community)
- **32,550** direct beneficiaries of the YPI grants
- **115,000** people in total were directly involved or impacted by YPI in 2020/2021

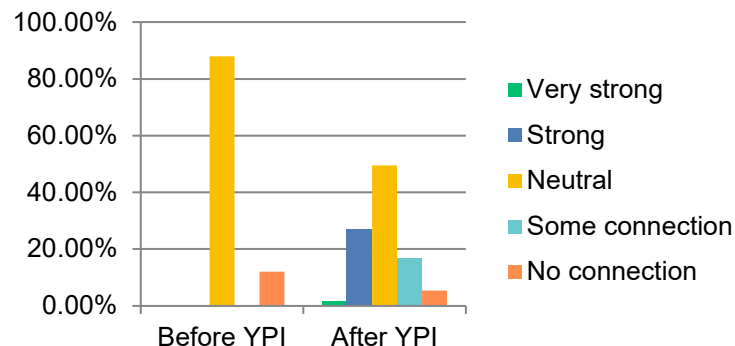

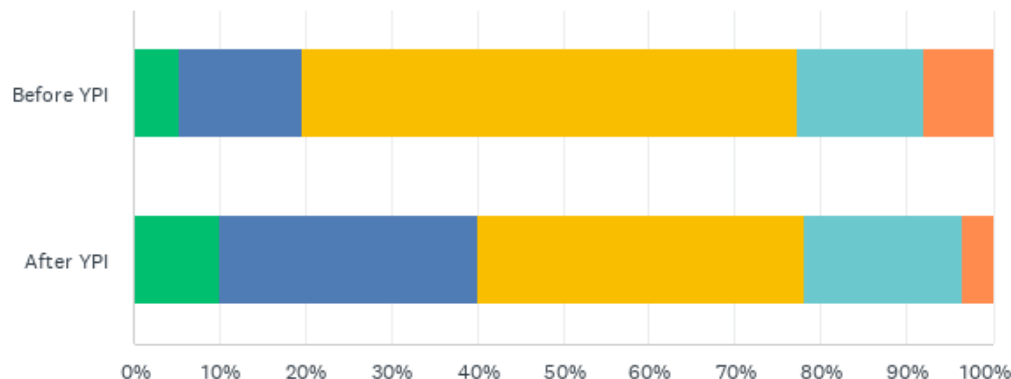

Impact on Students

YPI created significant positive change for students who reported the lowest levels of connection to their community.



YPI doubled the total number of students reporting “very strong” and “strong” connection to their community, and halved the number of students reporting “no connection”.



Note: This is a new survey question in 2021. The average percentages are taken from the current 2021/22 term one student survey and applied to the 2020/21 totals because we did not have access to this data in 2020/21.

Before YPI, fewer than 6% of grade nine and ten students in our 2021 post-program surveys reported that they regularly connected with others about social issues and/or the work of local charities in their community.

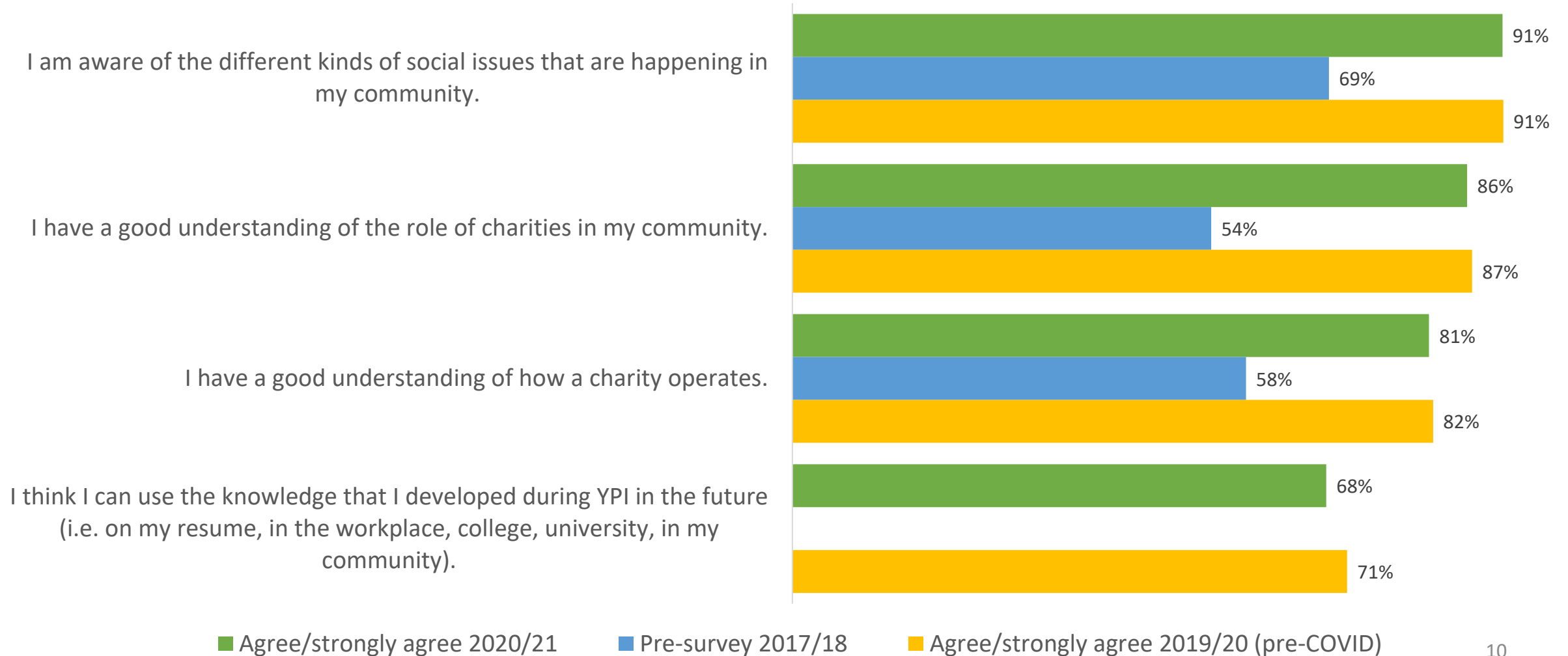

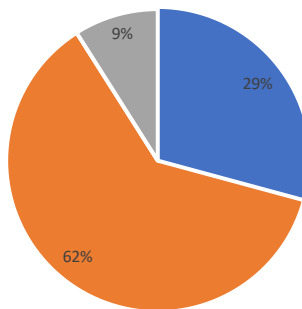

Delivery Models



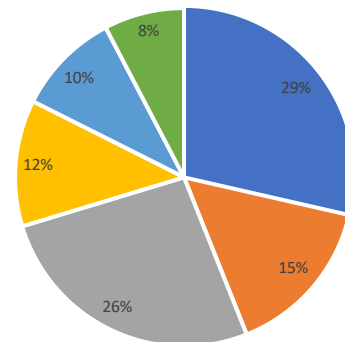

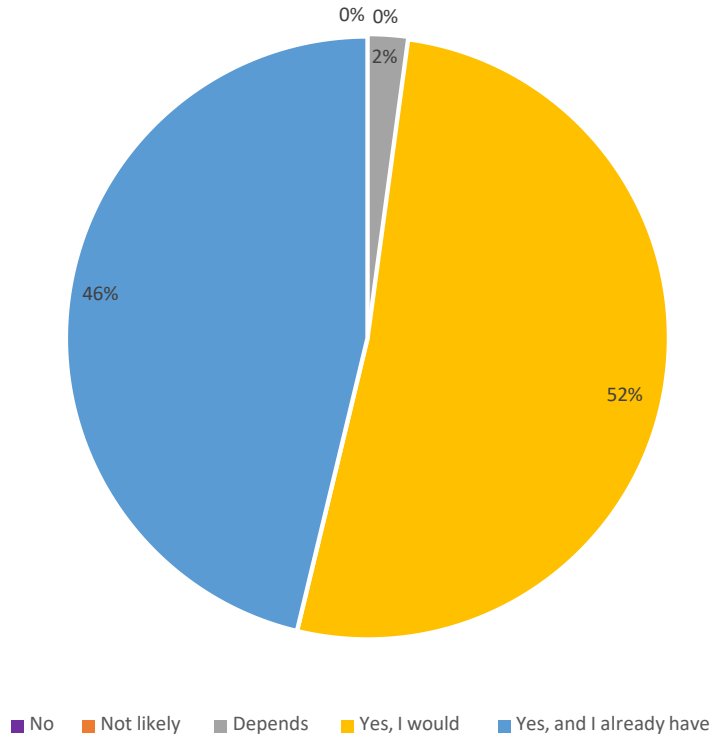

- Students lacked opportunities like YPI this year
 - *Students did not have any extra curriculums this year. This type of learning was interesting and creative. It gave students an opportunity to work with their friends or group members and use their creativity.*
 - YPI as embedded in curriculum and culture – desire to not leave one year of students out, i.e. fairness; wanting to continue student outcomes
 - *The entire "Active Citizenship" component of our Civics course has been built around YPI and it has always provided meaningful student engagement in class and the community.*
- Charities needed more support than ever
 - *The charities took a hit from COVID and it was important as a school to give back to those in need especially during a difficult time like this one.*

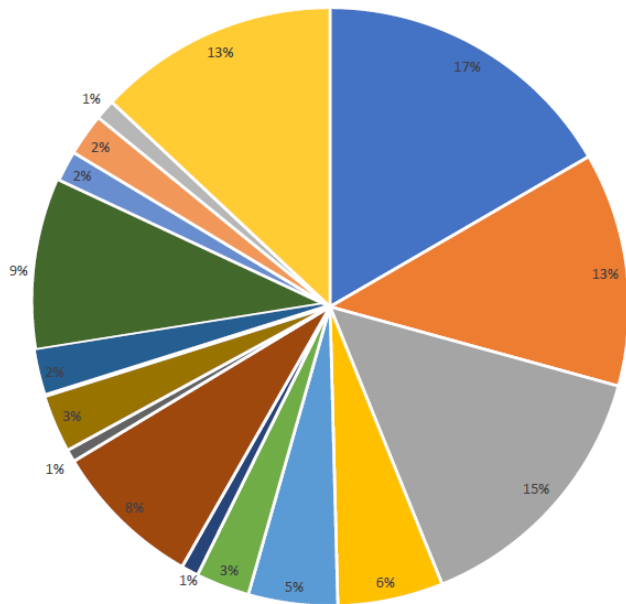

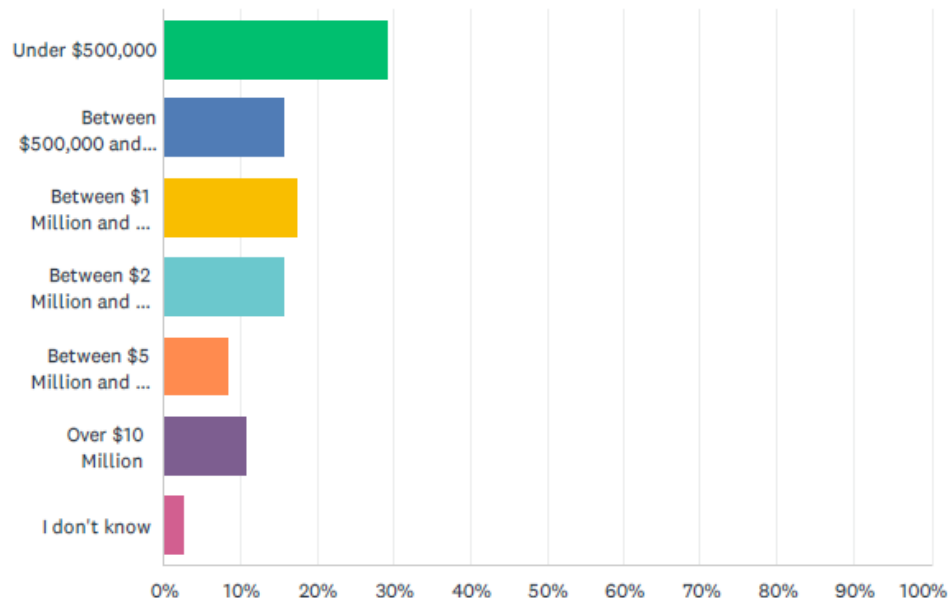

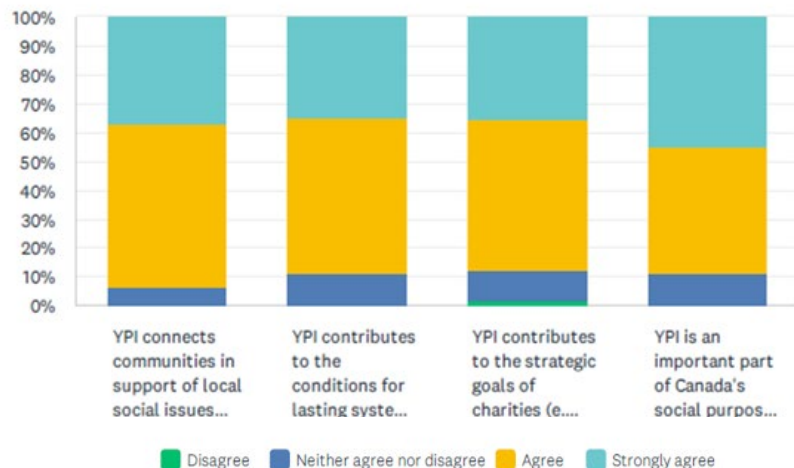

YPI Canada works with funding partners to award YPI Grants to charities that have been researched and pitched by local secondary school students through our award-winning participatory grant-making program. Usually, these grants are \$5,000 for one charity, per school. Due to the COVID-19 school closures and subsequent adaptations, in fiscal years 2020 and 2021 schools were given flexibility to split their \$5,000 grant evenly among their finalist students' research projects. Each school had \$5,000 in total to award to charities through this adapted process, and the grants awarded to charities ranged between \$500-\$5,000 per recipient. YPI Canada also made small donations (\$75-\$200) to charities that participated in focus groups and other specialized projects.
